## CHARLIE HART BIOG

Charlie Hart, born April 22<sup>nd</sup> 1948, studied classical violin from the age of 6. As a teenager in the '60s he developed a passion for blues, jazz and African music. As a multi-instrumentalist he worked with Pete Brown, the beat poet and Cream lyricist, and with Ian Dury in Kilburn and the High Roads.



Charlie went on to become a mainstay of Ronnie Lane's Slim Chance and recorded and toured

with Eric Clapton, Alexis Korner, Charlie Watts and others. He appeared in Mike Figgis' first feature film Stormy Monday, and composed music for film and TV, including the 1994 Oscar-nominated animated film, Triangle.

Charlie has always had a fascination for African music and has produced Samba Mapangala (leader of Orchestre Virunga) and the Moroccan Sidi Seddiki.

In 2004, he put together a Slim Chance line-up to back Paul Weller, Ronnie Wood and Pete Townshend at the Albert Hall. More recently Charlie has been performing, recording and writing with Chris Jagger.
